This is a tasty way to develop letter knowledge - the understanding that letters are different than numbers and have sounds.

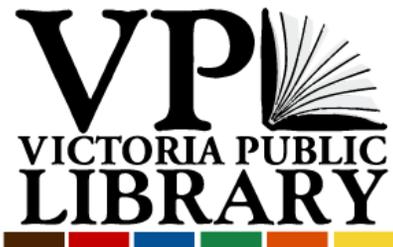
Create a grocery list!

Ask your child to make a list of groceries to get at the store. This may just look like lines and scribbles. Ask them to check items off the list as you put them in the basket. This helps support vocabulary development and knowledge about the world your child lives in.
