Draw and Tell!

Ask your child to draw a picture and then tell you about what they drew. Label the picture with important words or write their description underneath the picture. This helps build oral language skills and develop vocabulary.


Trace your names!

Use sand, flour or shaving cream to trace names, shapes, numbers and letters. This supports print awareness and the understanding that words have meaning.


Tap to the beat!

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
